B. Report of Staff

1. Comment on wanting to give a notice and participation regarding the River Councils. Sam will communicate with Preston regarding this

C. Report of Department of Environmental Conservation

- 1. Deer River
 - **a.** A lot of misinformation out there. No one should state that a specific farm or manufacture plant is responsible without evidence of discharge. Most likely multifaceted problem with numerous variables and many possible sources and most likely multiple sources.
 - **b.** DEC sampled the water most recently the week of June 10th. Thorough analysis of organics and nutrients to get an assessment of the nutrient levels in the river causing the growth.
 - c. DEC is setting up a meeting with county to discuss results.
 - **d.** Working with North Country Dairy. The lagoons are not full, they are functioning as they are supposed to. They are facultative lagoons that are designed to settle sludge to the bottom of them. The treatment system is functioning as it is permitted. No whey is being dumped directly into the river. There are multiple ways to improve and optimize function that are being explored and deployed
- 2. Rangers Academy currently underway 9 Candidates left
- 3. Interim Commissioner Sean Mahar

- 4. Appreciation for Peter D'Luhosch's work on the Five Pond Wilderness Unit Management Plan
- 5. PFAS question: Testing around the county, is there any indication of serious PFAS contamination? Answer: No indication of widespread contamination, but part of a program to monitor and look for it.
 - **a.** ProcellaCOR, an herbicide approved to use to treat aquatic invasive species Eurasian Water Milfoil, has been deemed by State of Minnesota as a PFAS. NYSDEC does not classify it as a PFAS, but has potential ramifications on its use in future. EPA issued a statement that it does not consider ProcellaCOR as a forever chemical or PFAS, PFOS
- 6. Question regarding a lake management plan for Tide Lake Franklin County. Unsure will follow up
- 7. Land and Forest Management group injecting 25 ash trees with pesticide for emerald ash borer
 - a. The insecticide is effective but it is expensive because it needs to be done on a tree by tree basis
