WHEREAS, human trafficking can occur in any industry, and is the fastest growing criminal industry in the world using violence and exploitive tactics to target vulnerable members of society, and

WHEREAS, due to the systematic use of physical, emotional, sexual, psychological and economic exploitation, control and abuse, the crimes of human trafficking violates the privacy, dignity, security, and humanity of individuals, and

WHEREAS, the impact of human trafficking is wide-ranging, directly affecting foreign nationals, as well as citizens of the United States, and society as a whole with victims experiencing trauma, violence, manipulation, fraud, and coercion at the hands of their traffickers, and it is often the most vulnerable members of our communities who are affected by human trafficking, and

WHEREAS, in 2020, 109,216 victims of human trafficking were identified worldwide,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** the Board of Legislators recognizes January as Human Trafficking Awareness Month, and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that all residents are encouraged to actively participate in the efforts to both raise awareness of, and to end, all forms of human trafficking in our communities, in the State of New York, and in the United States.

The Conflict Defender's Office is staffed with 5 attorneys, 1 legal secretary (LS) and 1 keyboard specialist (KS). The CD is seeking to create and immediately fill a second LS position, which would be 100% reimbursed under the Hurrell-Harring criminal justice funding, to assist the 5 attorneys and other support staff.

The LS has numerous duties, to include assisting attorneys with preparation of legal documents; scheduling; client intake; calendars; assisting clients and courts; notarizing documentation; and assisting Dept. Head with various administrative tasks such as payroll, billing, grant tracking, and reports. Additionally, this LS position would be assisting attorneys and clients primarily with criminal matters, allowing other support staff more time to assist on family court cases and general office work.

The LS would also assist Dept. Head with tracking and reporting criminal cases for grant funding purposes in coordination with the county's data position to ensure timely reporting and reimbursement requests. If position is not filled it leaves the office with only two support staff handling the overall office work, and assisting attorneys; and the KS position, due to civil service title, is unable to assist attorneys and clients with legal documentation and other necessary office tasks.
