





Chemical Dependency Visits Per




Chemical Dependency Weighted Face to Face %




Clinic Counselor Visits Average

Mental Health Weighted Face to Face






The Fiscal Manager will dedicated to ensure coordination among the project partners to effectively address the rural opioid crisis by overseeing grant activities. This person will also coordinate training, education and outreach activities; stakeholder involvement; fidelity monitoring; and assistance with required grant deliverables and reporting requirements. The Manager will act as a liaison between all of the agencies implementing the grant, not just the agency developing the OTP. The Fiscal Manager will work closely with a COSSAP evaluator to provide data and complete on-site evaluations over the performance period.

Additionally, Data will be collected through a survey to track administration of intake, length of stay and discharge from the sub-recipient agencies. The Fiscal Manager will be charged with analyzing the multi-agency data on a monthly basis and provide the St. Lawrence County Community Services Board and the SLCORR committee with a summary report including the following performance measures: Narcan training data, overdose rates, abstinence from use, housing status, employment status, criminal justice system involvement, access to services, retention in services, and social connectedness. Frequency analysis and descriptive statistics will be utilized to confirm patterns associated with certain risk and protective factors. Frequency analysis will be used to provide demographic information. The Comprehensive Opioid Abuse Site-based Program Combined Performance Measures will be generated on a quarterly basis. The Fiscal Manager will also compile data for annual reports. Lastly, will could work closely with the LGU Fiscal Officer to provide fiduciary oversight to ensure the County's interests are protected.

This position is critical in leading the COVID-19 response. This individual is responsible for administering/planning for vaccine administration, conducting case investigation, contact tracing, communication with area hospitals, health centers and facilities regarding testing and exposures, taking public health and COVID 19 on call, and mentoring and educating staff on the COVID-19 process and guidelines. In addition to COVID 19 responsibilities, this position leads the immunization, lead, communicable disease, maternal child health, and public health detailing programs in collaboration with the other PHNs. The Public Health Nurse requires a BSN in Nursing. Governor Cuomo signed a bill requiring future nurses graduating associate degree or diploma nursing programs to obtain a baccalaureate in nursing within 10 years of initial licensure to maintain their licensure. The BSN particularly covers coursework and fieldwork in public health practice which provides a strong foundation for the work of the department.

The position of Director of Services for the department is responsible to oversee and coordinate the work of various adult and children's services units in the department, including Family Services, Foster Care, Adoption, Child Protective and Child preventive. There are approximatively 150-200 CPS report calls monthly with 495 current cases either open or being monitored, 329 Children in care, 236 preventative cases, and the Family First Preventative Act currently in process with a start date of 9/2021, a huge undertaking for these units due to mandated criteria for reimbursement. This position supports the Commissioner with the services site of the department and will be the designee in the Commissioners absence.
