AUTHORIZING THE CHAIR TO SIGN AN AGREEMENT BETWEEN UNITED HELPERS, INC. AND ST. LAWRENCE COUNTY FOR THE RECOVERY AND RECOUPMENT OF PASS-THROUGH FUNDING OVERPAYMENTS

WHEREAS, since at least 2010, the County has provided pass-through funding from the New York State Office of Mental Health ("OMH") to United Helpers as payment for services, including, but not limited to: Assertive Community Treatment Program (ACT); Assertive Community Treatment Services; Health Home Care Management Services Dollars; Health Home Non-Medicaid Care Management Services; Supported Housing Community Services; and Supported Housing Rental Assistance, (collectively the "Services") United Helpers, Inc. provides to residents of St. Lawrence County, and

WHEREAS, United Helpers, Inc. provides these services pursuant to annual, written executory agreements ("Services Agreements") with the County, acting through its duly constituted St. Lawrence County Community Services Board under which payment to United Helpers is contingent upon payment to the County by the State of New York; the County is not liable for payments beyond the funds made available from the State; and if the State should recoup from current funding monies previously paid to United Helpers, Inc., the County is entitled to deduct the amount recouped from the current funding, and

WHEREAS, the State audits the documentation submitted by United Helpers, Inc. in support of its claims for Services submitted to the County to confirm its eligibility for payment and at times the State recoups from the County funds it determines were not reimbursable to United Helpers, Inc., and

WHEREAS, State audits are typically conducted retroactively, and the State will recoup any overpayments determined from the audits from the funds paid to the County years after the recouped payments have been made to United Helpers, Inc., and

WHEREAS, the Services Agreements between the County and United Helpers, Inc. for the Services and the pass-through payments provide, in pertinent part: "if during the term of this agreement, the appropriate State agencies for any reason whatsoever shall fail to approve full State Aid in reimbursement to the County for payments made previously by the County to the Agency, then the County shall deduct and withhold from any payment thereafter due under the agreement an amount equal to the amount of reimbursement denied by the appropriate State agencies," and

WHEREAS, from 2013 through 2020, the State has recouped funds from the County related to Services previously provided by United Helpers, Inc. for claim years of 2010 to 2017, and

WHEREAS, the Parties recognize the value of the Services rendered by United Helpers, Inc. to County residents and in order for United Helpers, Inc. to continue to provide said Services, the Parties have reached a tentative agreement related to the recovery of those recouped funds,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Legislators authorizes the Chair to sign an agreement and any supporting documentation necessary to carry out the agreement with United Helpers, Inc. regarding the recovery and recoupment of pass-through funding for the years of 2010-2017, upon the review and approval of the County Attorney.

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AUTHORIZING THE CHAIR TO SIGN A CONTRACT WITH EXCELLUS BC/BS TO PURCHASE STOP LOSS INSURANCE AND MODIFYING THE 2022 BUDGET

WHEREAS, St. Lawrence County (SLC) Health Insurance costs continue to rise at significant rates each year, and

WHEREAS, the County continues to research and implement programs in an effort to contain these costs, and

WHEREAS, some of the cost savings initiatives and measurable results St. Lawrence County has implemented over the years include: changing TPAs, renegotiating PBM (ProAct) contracts, auditing retiree drug subsidies, changing co-pay assistance for specialty drugs (20% to 30%), implementing Telemedicine, implementing USRx Care (prescription mgmt.), and implementing OptiMed (infusion therapy), resulting in over \$7 million in savings per year, and

WHEREAS, Burnham Benefit Consultants has secured Requests for Proposals for Stop Loss Insurance for St. Lawrence County several times in the past with the most recent being secured in November 2021, and

WHEREAS, these proposals show Excellus BC/BS to be the most competitive with the lowest premiums, and

WHEREAS, the Board of Legislators established a reserve in 2018 for high cost claims, which currently has a balance of \$1.5 million, and

WHEREAS, the Board of Legislators has decided Stop Loss Insurance would allow St. Lawrence County to better manage the risk of high claim costs, and

WHEREAS, the Board of Legislators proposes to use reserve funds to secure a Stop Loss Policy for coverage of specific claims over \$300K incurred between April 1, 2022 through December 31, 2022, for a premium of \$419,164, and

WHEREAS, the Stop Loss premium for 2022 will not be used to calculate 2023 Health Insurance Premium Equivalent rates, however; subsequent year premiums would be calculated into the Premium Equivalent rates due to the fact that it could provide savings and will provide assurance against claims in excess of the Stop Loss premium,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Legislators authorizes the Chair to sign a contract with Excellus BC/BS to purchase Stop Loss Insurance, upon approval of the County Attorney, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Treasurer is authorized to modify the 2022 Budget, as follows:

AUTHORIZING WAGE INCREASES FOR POSITIONS CATEGORIZED AS FLAT RATE MEDICAL PROVIDERS

WHEREAS, all non-union positions are categorized as a "Flat Rate" salary position, and

WHEREAS, the "Flat Rate" classification would allow for more latitude establishing salaries and in turn allow St. Lawrence County to be more competitive with other area healthcare facilities, and

WHEREAS, professional medical provider positions, such as Physicians, Physician Assistants, Nurse Practitioners, and other unique medical provider titles, have been identified as "Flat Rate" salary positions but have not been allocated to a Management Band with a step scale associated with it, and

WHEREAS, "Flat Rate" positions that have been allocated to a Management Bands receive annual wage increases according to CSEA negotiated annual wage increases and the identified Medical Provider positions do not receive annual wage increases, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Legislators authorizes wage increases for positions categorized as Flat Rate medical providers, effective March 19, 2022.

WHEREAS, the Notice of Authorization PY21-3 was issued with the remaining allocation of funding for Program Year 2021 WIOA Title IB Adult and Dislocated Worker programs, and

WHEREAS, a transfer of funds would provide more flexibility and ensure that WIOA is able to provide services to as many eligible participants as possible, and

WHEREAS, that all participants eligible for the Dislocated Worker program will be enrolled in the Dislocated Worker program, and no eligible participant will be denied services, including training services, due to transfer of funds, and

WHEREAS, WIOA Notice of Proposed Rulemaking Section 683.130, grant LWDBs the authority to transfer one-hundred percent (100%) of a program year allocations between the Adult and Dislocated Worker Programs, and

WHEREAS, the LWDB authorized, with Resolution Number 22-A12-01, the transfer of funds from the Dislocated Worker to Adult,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Legislators authorizes the Treasurer to modify the PY21 WIOA Budget to Transfer Formula Funds from Dislocated Worker Accounts to Adult Training Accounts, as follows:

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APPROVAL OF PAYMENT IN LIEU OF TAXES AGREEMENT IN RELATION TO SOLAR PROJECT ON PARCEL 64.002-6-1

WHEREAS, Potsdam Community Solar 2, LLC (the "Company") intends to build and operate a solar energy system as defined by the New York State Real Property Tax Law Section 487 (the "Project") located at US Highway 11 in the Town of Potsdam (Tax Parcel No. 64.002-6-1), and

WHEREAS, for those taxing jurisdictions that have not opted out of RPTL § 487; pursuant to RPTL § 487(9)(a), such a taxing jurisdiction could indicate its intent to require a PILOT Agreement with the developer, under which the developer, or any successor owner of the Project, will be required to make annual payments to the taxing jurisdiction for each year during the term of the PILOT Agreement, and

WHEREAS, St. Lawrence County has directed the Industrial Development Agency (IDA) to manage the PILOT negotiation process for the County with developers of such solar energy systems, and

WHEREAS, the Company seeks to enter into a payment in lieu of tax agreement with St. Lawrence County pursuant to the following terms: (1) Fifteen-year payment in lieu of tax agreement pursuant to Real Property Tax Law, § 487, and (2) \$1,159 per MW payment to St. Lawrence County, increasing two percent (2%) annually during the term of the agreement,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Legislators authorizes the approval of payment in lieu of taxes agreement in relation to solar project on Parcel 64.002-6-1, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the IDA will finalize the execution of payment in lieu of tax agreement pursuant to the terms set forth and will administer the billing and collection for the County for the term of the PILOT, upon approval of the County Attorney.

WHEREAS, Community Services has recognized the need for increased access of individuals with an Opioid Use Disorder (OUD) to recovery services in St. Lawrence County, and

WHEREAS, Community Services has received funding modifications from OASAS Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment (SAPT) Block Grant Program, and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 41-2022 authorized \$23,393 of the SAPT Blog Grant funds to be used for the purchase of Comprehensive Security System Equipment, Installation, & Maintenance to manage the security needs for SLCCS Opioid Treatment Program located at the Human Services Center, 80 SH 310, Suite 1, Canton (A1Z42502 26000 STB), and

WHEREAS, Resolution No. 314-2020 authorized the acceptance of the Comprehensive Opioid, Stimulant, and Substance Abuse Site-Based Program Grant, and

WHEREAS, funds from the Comprehensive Opioid, Stimulant, and Substance Abuse Site-based Program (COSSAP) will pay for the remaining balance in the amount not to exceed \$16,557 for the Security System Equipment, Installation, & Maintenance, and

WHEREAS, a competitive RFP was conducted to solicit bids for these services and upon review, NCC Systems is the successful bidder and is recommended for the award,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Legislators authorizes the Chair to sign a contract with NCC Systems Inc., for Security System Equipment, Installation & Maintenance for the Opioid Treatment Program, upon approval of the County Attorney.

IN SUPPORT OF ALL-TERRAIN VEHICLE AND SNOWMOBILE ACCESS ON THE RECENTLY ACQUIRED NEW YORK STATE CONSERVATION EASEMENT LANDS KNOWN AS THE SOUTH BRANCH GRASSE RIVER TRACT AND THE CRANBERRY FOREST

WHEREAS, since 2006, St. Lawrence County (hereafter, "County") has worked to develop an established a county-wide Multi-Use Recreational Trail System with connecting corridors for community access, and

WHEREAS, the Board of Legislators determined that authorizing the development of a county-wide Multi-Use Recreational Trail System would capitalize on the regions open space and forestry assets to provide quality outdoor recreation activities for visitors and residents, stimulating and supporting local business and regional economic development and conserving the natural resources for future generations, and

WHEREAS, since 2014, the Board of Legislators has worked to expand access on the Multi-Use Trail Recreational System by more than doubling the size of available trails and connections for recreational opportunities, and

WHEREAS, it has always been anticipated that additional trail segments would be added on an incremental basis in the future to the County-Wide Multi-Use Recreational Trail System, and

WHEREAS, in 2021, the State of New York announced that it had acquired 947 acres to be added to the Adirondack Forest Preserve and another 7,000 acres were acquired to be placed under a conservation easement, and

WHEREAS, the nearly 8,000 acres along the South Branch of the Grasse River in the towns of Colton and Clifton were purchased for \$4.3 million, and

WHEREAS, the Department of Environmental Conservation bought the parcels known as the "South Branch Grasse River Tract and the Cranberry Forest" from The Conservation Fund, an environmental nonprofit, and

WHEREAS, the easement acquisition connects several DEC easements, including the Conifer-Emporium, Grasse River, Seveys, Silver Lake, and Tooley Pond tracts, and

WHEREAS, the State of New York has specifically identified that the acquisition of the land in easement was for public recreational opportunities and has been supportive of recreational motorized vehicles use within the Grasse River Tract associated with the multi-use trail system before, and

- WHEREAS, the Board of Legislators envisions an opportunity whereby the Towns of Colton, Clare, and Clifton could be connected through a new Community Connector associated with the St. Lawrence County Multi-Use Trail System, and
- WHEREAS, in order to make such a vision reality, the State of New York would need to include motorized recreational vehicles, which includes all-terrain vehicles and snowmobiles, in the recreational offerings of the newly acquired parcel, and
- WHEREAS, in recent study conducted by Jefferson Community College and Camoin Associates of Saratoga Springs, researchers found that ATV riders spend \$6.6 million yearly in Lewis County associated with their trail system, and
- WHEREAS, at a time when the economy is weakened as a result of months of Pandemic response, the expansion of Multi-use recreational opportunities in an area of the State largely supportive of the activities, would hasten economic recovery,
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** the Board of Legislators supports All-Terrain Vehicle and snowmobile access on the recently acquired New York State conservation easement lands known as the South Branch Grasse River Tract and the Cranberry Forest, and
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Legislators urges the State of New York Department of Environmental Conservation to designate recreational motor vehicles, which include snowmobiles and all-terrain vehicles, in their recreational planning associated with the South Branch Grasse River Tract and the Cranberry Forest to permit the development of a community connector between the Towns of Clifton, Colton, and Clare associated with the St. Lawrence County Multi-Use Trail System, and
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that certified copies of this resolution be forwarded to Governor Katherine Hochul, Senator Joseph Griffo, Senator Patricia Ritchie, Senator Dan Stec, Assemblyman Ken Blankenbush, Assemblyman Billy Jones, Assemblyman Robert Smullen, Assemblyman Mark Walczyk and DEC Commissioner Basil Seggos.
