WHEREAS, the 2023 Sexual Assault Awareness Month campaign theme is *Drawing Connections: Prevention Demands Equity*, and focuses on changing ourselves and the systems surrounding us to build equity and respect, and

WHEREAS, systems of oppression such as racism, sexism, classism, heterosexism, ageism, and ableism contribute to higher sexual harassment, assault, and abuse rates, and

WHEREAS, often people are unaware of how historical conditions have shaped their lives and how they move throughout the world with many identities they each hold, and drawing connections between themselves, history, and the world around them is necessary for changing the future, and

WHEREAS, St. Lawrence Valley Renewal House provides St. Lawrence County with services which range from prevention, crisis intervention, counseling, and advocacy including a Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner Program, and

WHEREAS, sexual assault is a serious and widespread problem and St. Lawrence County can highlight sexual violence as a major public health, human rights, and social justice issue and respond to the needs of those most impacted by systemic oppression, and

WHEREAS, drawing the connections between various forms of oppression and the underlying causes of sexual assault is crucial to making real, large-scale, and lasting change in communities, and

WHEREAS, during the month of April events are planned throughout St. Lawrence County to highlight Sexual Assault Awareness Month,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Legislators declares April Sexual Assault Awareness Month, and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Board of Legislators encourages all citizens of the St. Lawrence County to join advocates and communities across the Country in playing an active role to raise awareness of sexual assault.

# MODIFYING THE 2023 BUDGET FOR THE OFFICE OF EMERGENCY SERVICES FOR THE ST. LAWRENCE COUNTY HAZARDOUS MATERIALS (HAZMAT) TEAM

WHEREAS, the St. Lawrence County Hazardous Materials (HAZMAT) Team was created to assist local rescue and fire departments in their response to incidents involving hazardous materials, and

WHEREAS, HAZMAT services were provided by the Ogdensburg Fire Department, at an annual fee of \$18,000, until the contract ended December 31, 2020, and

WHEREAS, since then the St. Lawrence County Office of Emergency Services resumed management and response operations of the HAZMAT Team, and immediately began soliciting volunteers to ensure continued response, and

WHEREAS, it has been recommended that a budget is be created for the HAZMAT Team to continue operations and ensure adequate response, and

WHEREAS, currently, the HAZMAT Team has forty-four (44) volunteer members and owns and operates two (2) trailers; one for entry purposes and one for decontamination, and

WHEREAS, the trailers are owned by St. Lawrence County and were previously stored in Ogdensburg; Resolution No. 43-2023 authorized a lease of space for the trailers to be stored at the Massena International Airport through December 31, 2023, and

WHEREAS, as the HAZMAT Team continues to operate and recruit new members, training costs are required for members to attend the initial 80-hour HAZMAT Technician Training normally offered for a fee in Montour Falls, conferences are needed to stay up-to-date on HAZMAT-related topics, and medical courses required to ensure adequate treatment of those exposed to hazardous materials, and

WHEREAS, repair and maintenance of HAZMAT equipment and trailers are anticipated; for example, hydrostatic testing of SCBA cylinders and repairs to damaged HAZMAT trailer items, and when possible the CNY Consortium will assist, and

WHEREAS, replacement and acquisition of HAZMAT equipment is necessary; such as replacement of personal protective equipment (PPE) suits, replacement of portable containment pools, and acquisition of additional tools and devices,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Legislators authorizes the Treasurer to modify the 2023 Budget for the Office of Emergency Services for the St. Lawrence County Hazardous Materials (HAZMAT) Team, as follows:
