CALLING ON GOVERNOR HOCHUL AND NEW YORK STATE LAWMAKERS TO REVERSE COURSE AND RESTORE BIOMASS AS AN IMPORTANT RENEWABLE ENERGY SOURCE TO STRENGTHEN THE ECONOMY AND ENCOURAGE LAND STEWARDSHIP AND RESPONSIBLE FORESTRY PRACTICES

WHEREAS, the cogeneration plant located on Fort Drum has provided an estimated three hundred (300) jobs across Northern New York to loggers, truck drivers, landowners, saw mill operators and others involved in the forest products industry, and

WHEREAS, due to the failure to recognize the benefits of biomass and forestry industry of the Empire State by Governor Hochul, the Public Service Commission, and leadership of the New York State Senate and Assembly, the plant is being forced to close, and

WHEREAS, the closure will cut off Fort Drum and the 10th Mountain Division, the largest single site employer in New York, from a reliable on-post electrical generating plant that supplies one-hundred percent (100%) of its energy needs, and

WHEREAS, closing the plant will make Fort Drum dependent on less secure energy sources that could be jeopardized by cyber-attacks, sabotage, natural disasters, and major weather events, and

WHEREAS, the loss of three-hundred direct and indirect forestry industry jobs will impact eighty (80) North Country businesses and cost the region an estimated \$25 million that will have a multiplier effect on the economy across the region, and

WHEREAS, forestry owners, farmers, land owners, saw mills, wood pellet companies, local governments, and others will also be negatively affected by the closure of the plant, and is just the latest example of how poorly thought out and ill-conceived the energy policies of New York are hurting working class citizens, reducing the availability of good paying jobs, increasing the price of electricity, and contributing to New York State being the worst place to do business in the nation,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED the Board of Legislators calls on Governor Hochul and New York State lawmakers to reverse course and restore biomass as an important renewable energy source to strengthen the economy and encourage land stewardship and responsible forestry practices, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this resolution be forwarded to Governor Hochul; U.S. Senator Charles Schumer; U.S. Senator Kirsten Gillibrand; Congresswoman Elise Stefanik; Congresswoman Claudia Tenney; Senator Joseph Griffo; Senator Mark Walczyk; Senator Dan Stec; Assemblyman Ken Blankenbush; Assemblyman Billy Jones; Assemblyman Robert Smullen; Assemblyman Scott Gray, New York Forest Owners
