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# PROHIBITING PLACEMENT OF THE SOCIAL MEDIA APPLICATION KNOWN AS 'TIKTOK' ON COUNTY-OWNED DEVICES

**WHEREAS,** TikTok, a popular social media application, is a wholly owned subsidiary of ByteDance, a Chinese corporation, and

**WHEREAS**, the People's Republic of China exercises control and oversight over ByteDance, under the Chinese National Intelligence Law of 2017, Data Security Law of 2020, and Cryptology Law of 2020, and

WHEREAS, the People's Republic of China can direct ByteDance to share user information, including real-time physical locations of users, as well as persistent access to the TikTok platform through encryption keys and "backdoor" functions, and

WHEREAS, TikTok gathers broad swaths of information from its users including personally identifiable information, location information, device specifications, and

WHEREAS, the continued operation use of TikTok on US government devices serves as a valuable tool to the People's Republic of China and the Chinese Communist Party to conduct corporate and international espionage and may allow the People's Republic of China to track the real-time locations of public officials and employees, and

WHEREAS, access to information and data from users using TikTok and its ability to share that data with a foreign adversary constitutes a risk to life-sustaining infrastructure such as emergency dispatch services, water and sewer safety, and electric grid, and internet access, and

WHEREAS, currently the device application known as 'TikTok' is prohibited in over thirty (30) states for many reasons including the concern included above related to unrestricted access to data, and

**WHEREAS,** in the 2021-2022 New York State Legislative Session Senate Bill S9613 proposed a similar ban and the State took up the concern in the bill, but ultimately adopted a policy that prohibited the application (app) on government owned devices, and

**WHEREAS**, there is a compelling public interest in protecting devices owned by St. Lawrence County from any unauthorized access, and

**WHEREAS** there may be extremely limited circumstances where County employees may need to access this application for fact-finding and investigation purposes,

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Board of Legislators prohibits placement of the social media application known as 'TikTok' on all County-owned devices, and

- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that County departments who may require access to this application will submit requests to Information Technology and may be granted limited and revocable access on devices that are not connected to the County network, and
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Board of Legislators directs the County Administrator to provide a full list of all software and hardware solutions currently used in County operations which fall under the jurisdiction of the Chinese Communist Party, and
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Board of Legislators urges all local governments and private businesses which are engaged in work of a public nature to adopt a similar restriction of 'TikTok' on their devices and networks, and
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that certified copies of this resolution be forwarded to Governor Kathy Hochul; Senator Mark Walczyk; Senator Dan Stec; Assemblyman Ken Blankenbush; and Assemblyman Scott Gray.

This senior caseworker position is essential to provide on-going in-house training for all new caseworker staff. This training curriculum includes all mandated OCFS training requirements, which includes bi-weekly in-house trainings on material provided by OCFS. In addition, the curriculum will include best practices, services forms, Connections, database training, as well as cultural competency, strength-based and trauma-informed practices. The senior caseworker trains new staff on federal, state, local policies, procedure, and practices to follow all regulatory requirements. The senior caseworker provides training in the field and in role playing case scenarios to best prepare and mitigate the potential for safety concerns. The senior caseworker will also create and train current staff in best practices and new regulatory requirements on an on-going basis. This position may provide regular training to experienced staff; mentor/coach staff that are struggling; and create instructional videos for staff that promote best practices. The will also take part in regular staff meetings, data interpretation relative to child welfare, and implementation of the most efficient and effective work practices.

### **Detailed Justification**

What is the impact on your department if this position is not filled? Please provide, in detail, the need to fill the position. Please include the service provided, if it is mandated, number of people (clients) affected, and what you will do if the position is not filled.

This Grade B Supervisor position would be responsible for directly supervising six caseworkers in CPS. As of March 2023, each Caseworker in CPS averaged 11 active cases. The expectation is that the Grade B Supervisor has day to day knowledge of the dynamics of each case and is actively working with the Caseworker to make safety decisions, provides guidance and assistance in initiating legal proceedings and testifying/appearing in family court, assigns new reports and manages the workload, periodically supervises Caseworkers in the field, provides assistance to on-call workers at all hours when needed, ensures that documentation meets standards and is completely timely (there is a 100% case review process in CPS; every document that the Caseworker produces is reviewed by a supervisor during the life of the active case and prior to the case closing), represents the agency in fair hearings, attends mandated trainings and meetings, and provides intensive training to new workers. The Office of Children and Family Services recommends for CPS Caseworkers 12 active investigations per caseworker. The Grade B Supervisor provides assistance to Caseworkers in organizing and managing their workload including assisting in drafting court petitions, following up with providers, making referrals to various agencies, attending family court, participating in a variety of case specific meetings, and other day to day activities that the Caseworker is not able to complete. When a caseworker is absent it is often impossible for another Caseworker to assist with the additional work, therefore the Grade B Supervisor must complete the absent Caseworker's duties as well as their own. The day to day crises that CPS Caseworkers encounter must be dealt with immediately. Children could be in imminent danger and familias must be seen and assessed and decisions must be effectuated.

What is the impact on your department if this position is not filled? Please provide, in detail, the need to fill the position. Please include the service provided, if it is mandated, number of people (clients) affected, and what you will do if the position is not filled.

The individual in this position completes all clerical duties for a Preventive/Foster Care Unit, which is comprised of a Grade B Supervisor and 6 Foster Care/Preventive Caseworkers. This position is responsible for Service Plan Review letters; court cards; reminders for all legal activity for the Unit; foster care placement documentation; movements of children in foster care; special payment for foster parents; clothing allowance payments for foster parents; caseloads and case logs; tracking case requirements; opening and closing of cases on the New York State Welfare Management System for foster care and preventive cases and the accurate recording of placement dates to ensure proper payment to providers; foster care subsidies; mailing; copying; and typing. Without this essential position, it would be impossible to comply with or successfully participate in Office of Children and Family Services audits. Further, DSS would receive sanctions for not being timely with service plan review letters to clients. Legal paperwork that is not completed and processed timely can result in children remaining in care longer than is necessary, at an increased expense to the Department. Keyboards in Child Welfare not only complete their own duties, they also ensure that all required documentation is completed by the caseworkers and communicate with the supervisor to ensure that work is being completed timely. It is impossible for Child Welfare supervisors to monitor all of the documentation that is required; they rely on the Keyboard to assist with this vital quality assurance role. This position will handle approximately 70+ foster youth with foster care placements and kinship placements as well as approximately 50 preventive youth and their families.

The Home Energy Assistance Program (HEAP) involves the issuing of fuel and utility payments to eligible families with low incomes. Social Welfare Examiners make the financial eligibility determinations, and staff in other units could not adequately absorb the duties. Not filling these positions would be extremely difficult since there is a very strong need for service once the colder weather is upon us and lack of staffing would place County residents at unnecessary risk. The 2022-2023 HEAP season started November 1, 2022 and applications for regular benefits ended March 31, 2023 and emergency benefits continue to be accepted until April 28, 2023. As of 3/31/2023, HEAP has received 4508 regular applications; 3,124 Emergency applications. Most seasons, households can potentially apply for up to 5 benefits with separate applications (regular, 1st emergency fuel, 1st emergency utility, 2nd emergency fuel, 2nd emergency utility) as well as Cooling Assistance, Clean & Tune, and Repair/Replacement. For 2022/2023 there has been 7,996 regular HEAP benefits, 1522 Emergency benefits, and 89 Furnace repairs and replacements benefits authorized as of January 2023. Cooling Assistance starts May 1, 2023 for the season. There were 372 Cooling benefits issued for the 2021/2022 season.
