Authorizing the Implementation, and Funding in the First Instance 100% of the Federal Aid and State "Marchiselli" Program-Aid Eligible Costs, of a Transportation Federal-Aid Project, and Appropriating Funds Therefore

WHEREAS, a project for Preliminary Design for the Lazy River Road Bridge over the Grasse River, BIN 3341820, PIN 775332 (the "Project") is eligible for funding under Title 23 U.S. Code, as amended, that calls for the apportionment of the costs of such program to be borne at the ratio of eighty-percent (80%) federal funds and twenty-percent (20%) non-federal funds, and

WHEREAS, the Board of Legislators wants to advance the project by making a commitment of one-hundred percent (100%) of the federal and non-federal share of the costs of Preliminary Design,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Legislators approves New York State Department of Transportation Supplemental Agreement for Preliminary Design for Lazy River Road Bridge over Grasse River, BIN 3341820, PIN 775332, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Legislators authorizes the Chair to sign all necessary agreements, certifications or reimbursement requests for available Federal Aid and/or State "Marchiselli" Aid for the advancement or approval of the Project, and provide for the administration of the Project and the municipality's first instance funding of Project costs and permanent funding of the local share of federal-aid eligible projects costs and all project costs with appropriations therefore that are not so eligible, and

WHEREAS, there is pending in the Northern District of New York Federal Court an action known to the Board of Legislators and subject to confidentiality restrictions, and

WHEREAS, this case was commenced on February 22, 2022, and

WHEREAS, a settlement of the matter has been proposed whereby the parties would agree that the County employees named in the action would have absolute immunity from any and all civil liability except for the relief proposed herein, and

WHEREAS, the parties would agree that the extent of the monetary liability for the settlement would be limited to the amount of \$12,500, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 71-1991, St. Lawrence County established a self-insured liability casualty reserve in accordance with Section 6n of the New York State General Municipal Law, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to General Municipal Law §6-n "upon the creation of the fund, the municipality may make expenditures from the fund for any loss, claim, action or judgment for which the municipal corporation is authorized or required to purchase or maintain insurance...", and

WHEREAS, this fund pays nominal or small claims with a separate line item established within the annual budget of the County Attorney to resolve claims that cumulatively do not exceed \$50,000 in the fiscal year, and

WHEREAS, the 2023 year has seen an unusual number of motor vehicle accidents on county vehicles, which when combined with the current matter, is projected to exceed the budgeted 2023 amount, and

WHEREAS, due to the number of claims received in the first portion of 2023, it will be necessary to transfer money from the Casualty and Liability Reserve account, by increasing the appropriated fund balance to cover those payments as they come due,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Legislators authorizes settlement of a Northern District of New York Federal Court Action, upon approval of the County Attorney, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that St. Lawrence County, upon receipt of appropriate general releases and a stipulation of discontinuance in a form approved by the County Attorney, is hereby directed to settle this claim on behalf of the County of St. Lawrence by payment of the sum of \$12,500, and

OPPOSING NEW YORK STATE SENATE BILL S4976A AND ASSEMBLY BILL A2084, "AN ACT TO AMEND THE ENVIRONMENTAL CONSERVATION LAW, IN RELATION TO PROHIBITING THE USE OF LEAD AMMUNITION IN THE TAKING OF WILDLIFE ON STATE-OWNED LAND AND LAND CONTRIBUTING SURFACE WATER TO THE NEW YORK CITY WATER SUPPLY"

WHEREAS, hunting is a way of life and an economically important tradition across St. Lawrence County, and

WHEREAS, NYS Senate Bill 4976A and Assembly Bill A2084 prohibits the use of lead ammunition in taking of wildlife on wildlife management areas, state forests, forest preserves, state parks or any other state-owned land that is open for hunting and on land contributing surface water to the New York City water supply, and

WHEREAS, while recognizing the potential harm cause by lead ammunition to the environment, an outright ban is neither logical or feasible, and

WHEREAS, the current science on this subject does not warrant a full ban on the use of lead ammunition while hunting, and resources would be better spent on educating hunters about non-lead alternatives, and developing programs to increase the supply and availability of non-lead hunting ammunition, and

WHEREAS, the availability of ammunition is currently erratic and manufacturers are severely backlogged and struggling to keep shelves stocked, and an outright ban on lead ammunition, without prior education, incentives, or phasing in, will hinder hunters and ultimately impact wildlife management programs, and

WHEREAS, a ban would likely hurt rural communities most where access to non-lead alternatives is minimal and costly, and

WHEREAS, further research should be conducted to understand the full scope and extent of impacts of lead hunting ammunition and how it affects the water supply in New York City,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Legislators opposes NYS Senate Bill S4976A and Assembly Bill A2084, "An Act to Amend the Environmental Conservation Law, in Relation to Prohibiting the Use of Lead Ammunition in the Taking of Wildlife on State-Owned Land and Land Contributing Surface Water to the New York City Water Supply," and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this resolution be forwarded to Governor Kathy Hochul; Senator Mark Walczyk; Senator Dan Stec; Assemblyman Ken Blankenbush; and Assemblyman Scott Gray.

WHEREAS, St. Lawrence County dairy farmers produced 895 million pounds of milk in 2022, ranking St. Lawrence County fifth in the Northeast Milk Marketing Area which extends from New Hampshire to Virginia, and
