WHEREAS, the St. Lawrence County Alternatives to Incarceration Advisory Board approved an extension of the Alternatives to Incarceration (ATI) Plan Contract No. CL17-1038-D07/C523950 for St. Lawrence County for July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024, and

WHEREAS, these pre-trial services were funded in the prior year, 2022-2023 contract term, in the amount of \$28,421, and

WHEREAS, the total cost of the ATI Program for 2023 is \$106,812, of which \$28,421 is funded by the ATI Grant (Q1033105 56000 ATI), resulting in a County cost of \$78,391,

OPPOSING SENATE BILL S.6282, "AN ACT TO REPEAL SECTION 257-C OF THE EXECUTIVE LAW RELATING TO PROBATION ADMINISTRATIVE FEES; TO AMEND THE EXECUTIVE LAW IN RELATION TO PROHIBITING CERTAIN FEES ASSOCIATED WITH PROBATION; AND TO AMEND THE CORRECTION LAW AND THE EXECUTIVE LAW IN RELATION TO TERMINATION AND DISCHARGE OF CERTAIN SENTENCES"

WHEREAS, Section 257-C allows for every county and the City of New York to adapt a local law requiring individuals currently serving or who shall be sentenced to a period of probation upon conviction of any crime under article thirty-one of the Vehicle and Traffic Law to pay to the local probation department with the responsibility of supervising the probationer an administrative fee, and

WHEREAS, in 1994, St. Lawrence County enacted Local Law No. 1 which allowed the Probation Department to collect a one-time fee of fifty dollars (\$50) for alcohol/drug testing, and

WHEREAS, in 1994, St. Lawrence County enacted Local Law No. 2, which allowed the Probation Department to collect a fee for those persons convicted of any crime under article thirty-one of the New York State Vehicle and Traffic Law, and this administrative fee was a maximum amount of thirty dollars (\$30) per month, and a portion could be waived if the person convicted is considered indigent, and

WHEREAS, Senate Bill S.6282 seeks to repeal Section 257-C of the Executive Law, which would prohibit the collection of any fee, including, but not limited to, an administrative fee, supervision fee, monitoring fee, or screening fee (alcohol/drug testing), and

WHEREAS, Probation Departments across New York State collect some variation of these fees to help offset departmental budgets, and if these fees discontinue, a greater financial burden will shift from the offenders to law-abiding taxpayers, and

WHEREAS, funding from State aid for Probation Departments dropped from approximately 49.6% in 1990 to around 10% in 2022, and to take further revenue from departments would be detrimental to maintaining staff and services, and

WHEREAS, St. Lawrence County Probation Department has collected a total of \$191,945 from 2018-2022: \$125,581 in supervision fees, \$31,620 in drug/alcohol testing fees and \$34,744 in restitution surcharges,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Legislators opposes Senate Bill S.6282, "An Act to Repeal Section 257-C of the Executive Law Relating to Probation Administrative Fees; to Amend the Executive Law in Relation to Prohibiting Certain Fees Associated with Probation; and to Amend the Correction Law and the Executive Law in Relation to Termination and Discharge of Certain Sentences", and

2023 Annual Review for Agricultural Districts 1 and 2

Each year, St. Lawrence County accepts requests to add agricultural land to Ag Districts 1 and 2. This year, the County received requests from six property owners to add land to both districts (see attached summary sheet, maps and photos). Under Ag and Markets Law, the Agricultural and Farmland Protection Board reviews these requests and makes a recommendation to the Board of Legislators that is based on two factors:

- 1. Whether the land is comprised of predominantly viable agricultural land, and
- 2. Whether the inclusion of such land would serve the public interest by assisting in maintaining a viable agricultural industry in the district.

To answer these two criteria, staff reviewed: information provided by the property owner, real property classifications, soil information, aerial imagery, and whether the requested addition was consistent with local land use regulations. This analysis helps avoid conflict between home rule law which allows towns and villages to determine land use regulations in their communities, and the protection of sound agricultural activities from unreasonable land use regulations under Aq and Markets Law.

This information was reviewed by the Agricultural and Farmland Protection Board at their meeting on April 6th, and the Board recommends the Board of Legislators add all parcels to Agricultural Districts 1 and 2. A legal notice announcing the requested additions, and the scheduling of a public hearing to receive public comment on the additions was held on April 20th. Copies of the legal notice with maps were distributed to property owners who requested the additions; forwarded to affected municipalities for posting; and the legal notice was published in the County's official newspapers. No one attended the public hearing, and no comments were received by staff.







WHEREAS, a settlement of a longstanding legal dispute between several counties, several named plaintiffs, and the State of New York resulted in a new mandate recognized as the Counsel at First Appearance, or Hurrell-Harring, service required that Counties operating an indigent defense program to provide counsel for indigent defendants at all critical stages of representation, to include arraignment, and

WHEREAS, in 2014 St. Lawrence County was one of the first counties to apply for and receive funding for the creation of one of the first Counsel at First Appearance (CAFA) Programs, and

WHEREAS, the New York State Office of Indigent Legal Services recognizes the challenges this creates for many counties particularly those with a number of rural courts, and

WHEREAS, in 2017, the New York State Office of Indigent Legal Services issued requests for proposals for a second grant associated with counsel at first appearance, and

WHEREAS, the availability of a grant to subsidize efforts toward implementation of a system to provide an attorney at first appearance for the indigent population that will assist the Office of the Public Defender, Office of the Conflict Defender, and the Office of Indigent Defense, and

WHEREAS, funds will be utilized to assist the support functions of the offices that provide indigent defense by providing a Legal Secretary for the Office of the Public Defender, a Keyboard Specialist in the Office of the Conflict Defender, as well as assistance to the anticipated cost of the Assigned Counsel Program for the provision of counsel at first appearances for clients,

WHEREAS, Resolution Nos. 248-2013 and 18-2020 authorized accepting the first and second CAFA Grants for 2013-2015 and 2017-2019, respectively,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Legislators authorizes the Chair to accept the Third Counsel at First Appearance Grant for 2020-2022, and sign a contract with the New York State Office of Indigent Legal Services, upon approval of the County Attorney.
