EMC "Policy and Position" on Nuclear Energy

At their Operations Committee meeting held March 21, 2022, the Board of Legislators was discussing a draft Resolution in support of declaring April 22nd as "Earth Day" in St. Lawrence County. Mr. Acres (District 8) asked: "I would like to know what the EMC's policy is concerning nuclear energy ..." Later in the discussion, Mr. Acres repeated his request: "So I would like to see the EMC take a position on nuclear energy and nuclear power."

The EMC's policy and position on nuclear energy and nuclear power is the following:

- Nuclear energy powers the universe, and is essential for life.
- Nuclear power has been in use in the U.S. to produce electricity for over 60 years.
- At present, 20% of electricity produced in NYS is from nuclear power. Therefore, nuclear power
 is an essential part of the State's energy portfolio.
- Nuclear power production presents potential hazards to public safety and the environment. These include: byproducts from mining and processing; the amount of fresh water used; radioactive emissions in the air and water; possibility of catastrophic failure; and, how to deal with nuclear waste for thousands of years.
- Nuclear power production should continue; the lifespans of existing plants should be extended as long as practical and safe. However, any new facilities should incorporate newer, safer technology.
- However, research and development should continue in order to develop safer and more efficient methods to produce electricity, from both nuclear and other sources.

WHEREAS, the New York State Department of Criminal Justice Services annually marks June as Gun Violence Awareness Month in recognition of responsible gun ownership and to promote greater awareness of gun violence and gun safety, and

WHEREAS, it is the custom of this Legislative Body to recognize official months that are set aside to increase awareness of serious issues that affect the lives of citizens of St. Lawrence County, and

WHEREAS, according to the Centers for Disease Control, there were approximately 40,000 people killed by guns in the United States in 2019, and

WHEREAS, according to Gun Violence Archive (GVA), a nonprofit organization that tracks media and law enforcement reports of shootings, at least 15,208 people were killed by guns in the United States in 2019, not including suicides, and

WHEREAS, gun-related deaths are the leading cause of death for American children, including approximately 3,400 gun-related homicides for 2019, and

WHEREAS, the New York State Department of Criminal Justice Services reports that in 2019, of the nearly 70,000 violent crimes committed in New York State, approximately 8,000 involved a firearm, and

WHEREAS, the New York State Department of Criminal Justice Services states, "access to a gun triples the risk of death by suicide," and

WHEREAS, the New York State Department of Criminal Justice Services states, "access to a gun in a domestic violence situation makes it five times more likely that a women will be killed, and

WHEREAS, gun violence continues to be a devastating crisis through the state with an increase of shootings and murders, and

WHEREAS, the damage caused by gun violence is not limited by gender, race, sexual orientation or ethnicity, and

WHEREAS, the effects of gun violence extend far beyond those struck by a bullet, and

WHEREAS, it is imperative that there be greater public awareness of this serious issue including prevention, intervention, education and outreach,
