## NCEMS Program Agency and REMSCO/REMAC report together

Report attached, highlights discussed

Correspondence from Bryan Goyette, EMS Provider with Potsdam Rescue, to be endorsed for the REMAC/REMSCO. Open positions were discussed and it was noted that the only opening was an education representative previously held by Bill Mason (SUNY Canton). Arthur Garno, who is currently overseeing the EMT program at SUNY Canton has expressed interest in joining the REMSCO.

<u>Motion</u> made by Craig Ballard to table endorsement of Bryan Goyette until Ann Smith has an opportunity to discuss potential membership on REMSCO with Art Garno, SUNY Canton, seconded by Jim Barr, motion carried.

## The following agencies were acknowledged and commended for Zero scratches

Cranberry Lake Governor Rescue Ogdensburg Parishville

Life Net/Air Methods – Steve Anderson provided stats from Air Methods (attached)

Discussion on the ability for plane to fly in more adverse weather than the helicopter and that Air Methods continues to work on identify the best resource to send. There are weather situations that the fixed wing can't fly, but they are less than the helicopter.

Teamwork and communications will help ensure that the correct resource is asked for and sent.

Question asked regarding the ability to staff pilots, currently all pilot positions are full, although one pilot will be leaving, they have 4 applications for the position. The bigger challenge is clinical staff due to the time it takes to train and orient them (2 to 3 months after hire date before they are actually working at base, then orientation continues locally).

Discussion on upcoming construction on airfield in Potsdam. The fixed wing will be temporarily relocated for approximately 90 days to the Massena Airport. Clinical decisions will need to made as to whether the patient goes to the hospital or directly to aircraft in Massena. Helicopter can still land at the airport. The construction starts on May 9<sup>th</sup>, relocation will occur sometime between the 1<sup>st</sup> of the month and the construction start date. Communications will be sent out through the Program Agency and Public Safety when the aircraft relocates.

Canton Potsdam Hospital is working directly with them to ensure transfers can continue smoothly.

**Upcoming Trainings-** Covered in the Program Agency Report, Reminder Isolation quarantine for rural communities on April 15<sup>th</sup>. Watch email for some additional trainings up and coming in Syracuse, Mark Deavers is doing a BLS training day March 26<sup>th</sup> at Gouverneur rescue all are welcome, please RSVP Mr. Deavers.

<u>Old Business</u> – Hospital letter were sent, although Ann forgot to include the biodata sheet and forgot to tell Tammy LaBrake her name was used as an RSVP on it, Mike LeCuyer volunteered to let her know.

Leadership meetings continue, last one held in February- Scratch rates provided, good attendance, many requests for training. Scratch rates will eventually be mailed to agencies, if no participation

from agencies the scratch rates will be sent to their municipalities. The next leadership meeting is the 4<sup>th</sup> Tuesday in April.

Carol Muench spoke with Dr. Healy and he desires to resign from the committee as he is unable to contribute to them. We will need a physician; Carol would like to send a letter out to the hospitals to see if any physicians step forward.

Joyce Dalton received her letter of endorsement from the St. Lawrence County Legislature for membership on the board. Discussion on positions, why are they not 3 years, it was explained that new members go into the remaining term of the position that they fill.

### **New Business**

Ambulance transport of patient receiving Blood, Julie Sciorra reviewed Draft forms from NYS DOH policy statement and had a few questions and discussion ensured over the process. The ambulance service must be the ones that draw up the forms. The process is very complicated, agencies have to apply and be approved by the NYS DOH. This is a cumbersome process for the agencies, must have a training program done by specific hospital staff, each EMS agency has to have a separate policy with each hospital they transport from, ambulance members need to become part of the hospitals transfusion process just to name a few of the requirements. It is very brutal and time consuming to complete. Julie Sciorra asked how to proceed, Ken Gardner stated that the agencies had to decide if they wanted to even do this at Ogdensburg Rescue. Hospitals and agencies who are going to potentially do this need to meet and work through the process. Currently Canton Potsdam Hospital is working on this and Gouverneur Hospital and Rescue.

Canton Potsdam Hospital will be sending a letter out regarding their provisional trauma level and the 2011 trauma triage guidelines. Discussed that they should be receiving all trauma patients that meet trauma center criteria. This is endorsed at the state level through the trauma committee. They would like to engage and educate EMS on the process.

Claxton Hepburn is working diligently on having 24/7 neurology available for stroke patients via telemedicine. Next EMS meeting at Claxton Hepburn this will be discussed, potentially this will be held the second week of April.

Trouble getting Narcotic orders discussed, recommendation that this be reviewed through the QA/QI process with service/hospital medical directors involved.

Piercefield has disbanded their CFR unit

### **Election of Officers**

Chair -Jim Barr, Mark Deavers, Carol Muench- Mark Deavers indicated that he is willing to drop as long as others are interested. Discussion ensued as there has never been more than one candidate for a position.

Motion to change hemorrhage control protocol to add that the tourniquet should be placed at least 3 inches above the wound, not over the joint. Unstable scene place high and tight and wording about transport to trauma centers. Motion carried

SEMAC advisory's rescinded on treatment of hemophilia and biphasic defibrillation, should be part of current curriculum- motion carried

Motion to approve BLS acquisition of 12 lead as a regional adjunct as discussed at the last meeting. REMAC must regionally approve it- Motion carried

Update on Check and inject, epi pens should be kept if possible but they are not required to. No uses at this time

#### **PIER**

Reminder that in May 2015 it was motioned and approved for award nominations to be sent in by May  $1^{\rm st}$  to comply with award program for national submissions to be done by state. Regionally they are needed by March  $15^{\rm th}$  to process

Decline in award nominations, reminder to the importance of submitting applications and request for this to be brought back to each region

### **Education and Training**

New CIC /CLI exam will begin in May

Motion to rescind the 85% score passing requirement for CIC/CLI to achieve on NYS written exam within 3 years of certification- Motion carried

Motion to require all instructors to achieve a one-time passing score on the new instructor exam as a new or recertifying instructor. Motion carried

Passing 70% if you fail then you can take again, second failure would have to do remediation course that will be developed as an online course prior to taking again.

They have completed the 4 hour instructor informational session online for new instructors who going through the NAEMSE fast track method of obtaining instructor certifications. No more trips to Albany

CLI course curriculum that has been in trial for a couple of years was discussed. Motion to approve curriculum carried

Bureau will begin printing certification cards in house

AEMT level pass rate went up

CPAP is a regional add on and needs to be done by advanced instructor

## S03500 or A0 1175 motion to oppose this bill motion carried

TITLE OF BILL: An act to amend the public health law, in relation to the provision of municipal advanced life support first responder service or municipal ambulance service

SUMMARY OF PROVISIONS: Subdivision 7 (b) of Section 3008 of the Public Health Law is amended by removing the requirement that a municipality or

fire district apply to their requisite regional emergency medical services council for permanent operating authority at the conclusion of their initial two-year period and instead requires the Commissioner of Health to approve a subsequent application for permanent operating authority unless the municipality or fire district has failed to meet all standards set by the department for appropriate training, staffing and equipment.

## Support A01431 exempt sales tax for new or used ambulances for all motion carried

Relates to exemption of new and used ambulance vehicles to an emergency services organization, pursuant to a

written contractual agreement, for use in the transportation of emergency services personnel, under the sales and compensating use taxes.

SUMMARY OF SPECIFIC PROVISIONS: Section 1. Subdivision (a) of section

SUMMARY OF SPECIFIC PROVISIONS: Section 1. Subdivision (a) of section 1115 of the tax law is amended by adding a new paragraph 26-a to read as follows:

New or used ambulance vehicles to an emergency services organization,

pursuant to a written contractual agreement, for use in the transportation of emergency services personnel. For purposes of this paragraph, the term "emergency services organization" means a public or private agency, organization or group organized and functioning for the purpose of providing fire, medical, ambulance, rescue, housing, food or other services directed toward relieving human suffering, injury or loss of life or damage to property as a result of an emergency, including non-profit and governmentally supported organizations, but excluding governmental agencies.

Motion to support legislation to establish Medicare rates so providers can recoup costs motion carried Motion to oppose A02043-

Requires ambulances to provide victims of motor vehicle accidents with information about certain insurance benefits available to such victims.

Motion to oppose operation outside of territory A02058- Enacts the Good Samaritan ambulance act of 2015 to allow the provision of ambulance services outside of an agency's primary territory in emergencies. No consideration of mutual aid given in the bill. Motion carried

**Motion to support** legislation that would provide diesel fuel sales tax exemption, motion to support carried

Motion to support legislation to add amber, blue and green lights under move over law . Motion carried

### Community paramedicine legislation

Home care folks stopped action as they thought EMS would be reaching into their scope of work, Discussions ongoing with them, once a deeper understanding was achieved they made some progress and identified a Hospital collaborative with physician group that allows them to do additional things outside legislation and the proposal is to add them in. This is a demo project.

Discussion on proprietary /not for profit companies concern on potential implications of minimum wage hike to \$15.00 due to the fractured reimbursement system this may really be a challenge
