Rendering, drawing, or sketch prepared to specifications, containing necessary elements (listed in zoning ordinance or local law), which shows the arrangement, layout and design of the proposed use of a single parcel of land as shown on plan




What a Site Plan Can Look Like






- 52,000 sq ft. MOB/ASC
- Large parking area, 320 spaces proposed
- One access road onto a major highway (US 11)
- Separate central plant building
- Land has a variety of soil types








Site Plan Considerations

- Parking and access
- Storm water management
- Snow storage
- Accessory uses
- Lighting and signage
- Environmental constraints

Soil Conditions

- Limited Class II soils
- Understand what is going where
- Consider rearranging lot configurations

Area Variance Balance of Interest Tests


1. Change to neighborhood character

2. Alternatives not requiring a variance

3. Substantiality of the request

Effect on physical or environmental conditions


5. Is the situation self-created?





Area Variance Case Study, Side Yard Setback

- Applicant needs 10' setback
- Proposed garage will increase separation distance
- Lot size is limited
- Buffer currently exists

Area Variance Case Study, Signage

- Applicant has proposed a sign that exceeds the 20 square foot max by 286 square feet; a 306 square foot sign
- Applicant has submitted arguments for balance of interest tests, stating signage standards are dated and impact on surrounding community will be minimal



Use Variance Legal Tests

The "burden of proof" is on the applicant

- 1. No reasonable return
- 2. Unique circumstances
- 3. No alteration to essential neighborhood character
- 4. No self-created hardship



Government Services

Use Variance Case Study, Auto Sales and Service

- Applicant proposes to sell limited number of cars, RVs, ATVs and watercraft, and provide service from residence
- Applicant argues financial hardship has forced downsizing
- Property is "unique" because it already has garage space


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Use Variance Case Study, Auto Sales and Service

- Community character won't be impacted because there is good separation distance from neighbors
- Applicant has not created own hardship, financial and health concerns dictated need to relocate business to residence
