TICK PREVENTION!

- Tick exposure can occur year-round, but ticks are most active during warmer months (April-September).
- Ticks can spread disease. Although not all ticks can cause disease and not all bites will make you sick, it is important to learn how to prevent a bite and how to remove a tick.



• Keep in mind that some symptoms of a tick bite are similar to those of COVID-19.



PREVENT A TICK BITE

- Wear light colored clothing to easily spot ticks.
- Use repellent containing 20-30% DEET. Spray on shoes, clothing and hats.
- Examine gear and pets.
- Shower after being outdoors.
- Do a full body tick check.




AVOID CONTACT WITH TICKS

- Avoid wooded and brushy areas with high grass and leaf litter.
- Walk in the center of trails.

TICK REMOVAL

- 1. Use a pair of pointed tweezers.
- 2. Grasp tick by the head or mouth right where it enters the skin.
- 3. Pull upward with steady, even pressure.
- 4. Wash the bite area with soap and water.

2022 RABIES CLINIC SCHEDULE

Rabies is a preventable viral disease most often transmitted through the bite of a rabid animal. The vast majority of rabies cases reported to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) each year occur in wild animals like bats, raccoons, skunks, and foxes, although any mammal can get rabies.

Protect your pets by making sure they are up-to-date on their rabies vaccinations!
